

HOW TO ACCESS THE FIRST NEWS DIGITAL NEWSPAPER



ON ANDROID AND iOS DEVICES

- 1 Download the 'First News' app from Google Play or the App Store
- 2 Tap the settings icon at the bottom of the screen and then select, 'Sign in'
- 3 Enter your school's First News Education ID and tap 'Sign in'
- 4 Select 'Paper' in the bottom of the screen to download and access the latest issue of First News

Your school's First News Education ID can be found in your welcome pack, as well as in the email you received containing details about your package.

Remember, your subscription gives every pupil access to First News, you can deploy the First News app to multiple devices using your MDM solution.

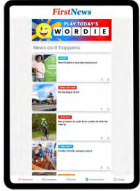
- 1 Visit digitaledition.firstnews.co.uk and enter your First News Education ID

Keep up to date with the latest news, daily on the First News app! In addition to our weekly newspaper, your pupils will now have

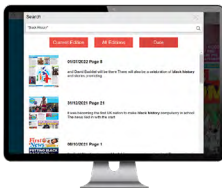
access to each day's biggest news. This feature is perfect for topical debates and discussions, and to support your school's news-reading community.
