TEACHING IDEAS

1. The 'Quick News' pages are a great source of discussions for warmup activities
2. 'World News' stories help children understand and make sense of current world events
3. Ask your students to dissect the paper and annotate the different features of an article; use articles as model texts for children's own writing
4. Use 'Special Reports' to encourage informed discussions and broaden students' vocabulary
5. Build a news archive in your library or classroom to inspire reading non-fiction for pleasure
