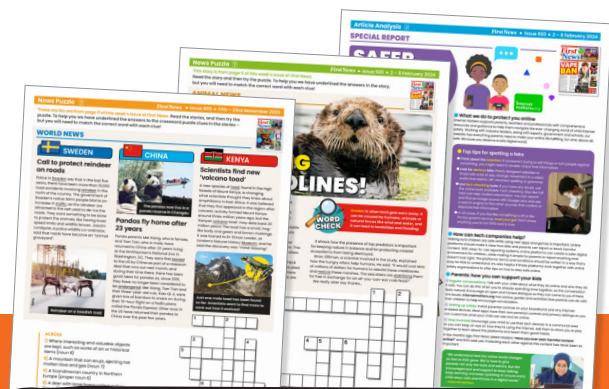

TEACHING IDEAS

1. Use the puzzles to build banks of tier 2 and tier 3 vocabulary, with definitions
2. Model key comprehension skills of retrieval, prediction, sequencing, inference and comparison, by working through individual questions on the IWB
3. Equip your students with balanced information to drive debate and confident discussion; forming and articulating their own opinions, and listening to those of others
