FRANCE - Inheritance surprise

A Frenchman who was lucky enough to inherit a house from a relative found out he'd actually <u>received</u> more than just a new home. After moving into the property in Normandy, the man <u>found</u> a whopping £3 million in gold pieces, stored around the place! There were around 5,000 individual gold pieces, two gold bars <u>weighing</u> 12kg and 37 smaller gold ingots – all hidden under rugs, inside sofas and behind pieces of furniture.



AFRICA - Are elephants evolving?

An increasing number of African elephants are being born tuskless because <u>poachers</u> have consistently targeted and killed the elephants with the best tusks over the years. This has meant that only the <u>elephants</u> without tusks have survived to have children. In the Addo Elephant National Park in South Africa, 98% of female elephants have no ivory – and the few that do had much smaller tusks than the elephants which were born in the same park just 100 years ago.
